## Food Insecurity: PSU, Portland, and Beyond

## What is Notable

The *What is Notable* portion of your course grade (70%) includes:

- Two four-page papers submitted to D2L
- Two What is Notable submissions with notes on three readings, videos, and/or websites
  of your choice--each focused primarily on what is most notable to you (some weeks will
  have REQUIRED next to some materials indicating that item is required in your What is
  Notable file or notes)
- Flipgrid videos of What is Notable of weekly materials

Keep notes of three specific materials per week (this doesn't mean read only three, this means you need to take notes on only three) in any form you choose--Word, Google Docs, handwritten, etc. This will be uploaded twice during the term to the Assignments box. This can be a Word doc, Google Doc, PDF, or graphic file (if you've handwritten--which is fine--you need to combine all images into one file).

## Article and video details:

- 1. Create clear definition for each article or video
  - Write the article or video name prominently so it's distinguishable from the next entry
- 2. Include the following sections for each article or video:
  - Biases and limitations
    - i. Briefly include the biases expressed or hidden in the article or video
    - ii. Look for any limitations that you perceive in the article or video
  - Data
    - i. Jot down important data presented in the article or video
  - What is notable?
    - i. Note any important aspects of the article or video
    - ii. What do you perceive as notable?
    - iii. Be prepared to discuss this in weekly videos

## Website details:

- 1. Separate page for each website
  - Organization name (such as "Oregon Food Bank")
- 2. What seems most important? What is impactful in regard to hunger and food insecurity? What is notable?
